Toppers (for those 10 to 15 years old) should use their own boat if they have one, club boats will be available for those who don't have their own.

Junior Saturday Club - 'FUN RACE' report by Diana



This 25-minute race starts promptly at 13.00 to enable any sailor from the AM or PM sessions to join and have a go. If you can tack, gybe and sail a triangle you should have no difficulty in taking part. We also have a support boat and an instructor on the water giving help and advice to anyone that needs it.

As it was the May half term many families were on holiday so there were less sailors taking part in both morning and afternoons secessions. Due to this we only had three sailors for the Fun Race, two Toppers and one Oppie. It was pretty windy and we enjoyed watching them have a great time planning on the run on each lap (Yes Oppies do plane!). Thank you to Geoff for laying the course, along with Stuart and Maxine who covered the sound signals and lap records, this was a great help.

The results: Szymon 1st in a Topper, Teddie 2nd in an Oppie, closely followed by Hugh in a Topper. There were no capsizes and it was a very exciting race to watch – well done.

The race is open to all Junior Saturday Club attendees and here are a few tips to help those new to the fun race.

TIME TABLE FOR 'FUN RACE:

- 1. <u>Find a boat</u> If you are using a club boat please ask an instructor to allocate you with one or rig your own ready for **12.30**.
- 2. <u>Sign on</u> add your name, class of boat, and sail number and sail size to the signing-on sheet located just outside the clubhouse.
- 3. <u>Briefing 12.30pm</u> (changed ready to sail) this takes place outside the clubhouse
- 4. Launch 12.40 head out to the sailing area by the Maid of Kent.

The race starts at 13.00 - sailors need to be near the MOK about five minutes before that to hear the countdown whistle for the start. Finish after 25 minutes (2/3 laps)

Hopefully it is now Summer, so remember you will need suntan lotion and a hat. If wearing a cap you will need some string to tie it on to your buoyancy aid.

RYA Levels 1&2 and Stages 1&2 - Report by Jeff



Seven of our young members and five adults signed up for the Stages 1&2 and Levels 1&2 course. The first day saw very little sailing due to the very



strong winds. The youngsters went out, with reefed small sails, for a short while in the afternoon when conditions seemed to have eased, but the lull didn't last. Cathryn and lan, who were instructing the adults, took a 2000 out later to test the conditions, again it started off OK, and then the wind blew up again, so the adults stayed ashore.

The second day was still windy but sailable with reefs and smaller sails, a downpour just before lunch caused a lull for a while but the wind got up again for the afternoon.

The third day was probably as close as we get on Hedgecourt to ideal for training, the sun was shining and the wind was manageable without needing to reef.

It looks like the fourth day will have very light winds, completing a full range of wind conditions.

The students are all progressing and hopefully by the time you read this they will have achieved their goals.

NEW! CMYC Model Yacht Group







There was a good turn-out last Wednesday for the inaugural meeting of the new CMYC Model Yacht Group. We had an assortment of six model yachts for members to try. A Hurricane, a DF-95, a DF-65, an RG-65, my vintage Marblehead, a Footy and by way of a complete contrast a fluorescent lime green electric racing catamaran. Even the Egyptian Geese retired from the Clubhouse corner of the lake on seeing this last offering! The evening was an opportunity for members to share ideas about the new group and model yachts in general. We discussed preferred classes to adopt, Model Yachting Association (MYA) affiliation and preferred times to go sailing. For those of you who could not attend the forum is still very much open. Here is my discussion document. I would love to hear from all members who are interested in model yachts.

I need to know who is interested, whether you have a model yacht and if so what type. If you do not, might you add one to your Birthday or Christmas list?

Assuming that there is sufficient interest my recommendation would be to adopt a preferred class to allow for racing on equal terms. This does not preclude fun sailing with a mixed fleet. My recommendation would be to go for the Dragon Force 65, the smaller of the DF one design yachts. It is the least expensive and comes semi-assembled with our without radio gear as you choose. It has an active Class association, is sailed at numerous clubs locally, nationally and globally. There are a number of optional rig options, but I would suggest we stick to the standard A rig as supplied at least initially.

I would aim establish a club fun racing series once we have 4 or 5 boats. I would like suggestions as to preferred days, mornings, evenings that might fit in around the Clubs existing programme and your busy lives. We don't need a lot of space or resources. Two key points that were learnt today: 1. Don't be too far from the start line in the five-minute countdown. 2. Never give up, there is always a chance that things will change in your favour.

Well done everyone and thank you for making this a success.

Our next Have A Go Racing session is on 14th July, with the first race starting at 14:30, try to be at the club for 13:00 so that there is ample time for the briefing and answering any questions.
