


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Awards Evening (Presentation of 2024 Awards)

Below is a taste of what we are doing for each of these:

Together (Community)

RYA recognise affiliates that champion equality and eliminate barriers to participation for individuals or communities historically underrepresented in boating activities.

NEW For 2025. CMYC are introducing Community Spaces to share the beautiful view across the lake from our Clubhouse grounds with others from the local community, such as residential care homes. This can help with mental health as well as being a social opportunity to care for others and promote this core aspiration.

NEW The Sailability review started in 2024 will provide a prioritised approach to improving our support and eliminating barriers to participation.

Green Blue

RYA recognise affiliates implementing sustainable practices or introduce environmental projects that minimise their environmental impact.

NEW The Management Committee took the Green Blue Pledge to shape future decisions and encourages everyone to support this ambition to protect our lake and SSSI. All 2023 & 2024 flotilla yacht crews are understood to have signed this pledge.

Crew Development (Young Persons)

RYA recognise affiliates who encourage participation, development of skills and volunteering for all their (young) people.

NEW CMYC have introduced the Grebe Club to support skills development in addition to any formal training. This initiative also strengthens our social dimension, improves membership engagement and re-introduces youth leadership.

Active

RYA recognise affiliates that develop strong participation opportunities which enable members to stay active throughout their life on the water.

The CMYC 2025 Programme is very 'active', integrating a wide range of events from sailing, racing, cruising, kayaking, swimming, flotilla sailing, model yachting and socials – quite an adventure, start yours today.

Limitations: These were accepted noting that the introduction of new initiatives should not impact on the delivery of formal training, must not require Instructors to volunteer additional time and must only 'teach' RYA approved sailing methods.

Harry and I have booked a Beneteau 35 for the CMYC Club Flotilla leaving Gatwick for Greece on 12 October 2025 for one week.

Pricing: We are currently paying £1450 each that includes flights, transfers, security waiver (damage protection), fuel and a contribution to mooring fees. If you join us this price will reduce as we share the yacht charter fee. If we get enough interest, we might upgrade the yacht to 50' (if available) with four en-suite cabins for no more than above.

Full details can be found here. We are on the South Ionian highlights flotilla.

The small print: We are looking for crew that would like to help, even if in a small way, to make it a holiday for everyone. Yacht experience is not required but is always useful. Crew should have an App ready smart phone with data to track additional expenses as we intend to eat out every night. We are looking for non-smokers. It may help you to know that we are yacht savvy, have related qualifications and experience, and together can manage the boat.

Commitment: We wish to meet prospective crew members over a cup of coffee at the Clubhouse on 22 March at 10 for 10:30 where you might also meet some of the other flotilla participants. This is a once only opportunity to meet before we finalise our plans.





TREE CUTTING

Join in the 'Fun Race' at Junior Saturday Club

15th March 2025







Open to all Junior/Youth sailors, so do come along and join us.

We hold one of these races at each Junior Saturday Club and it is held between the morning and afternoon sessions, this enables those coming to Saturday Club to have some extra sailing and additional tuition. It is a relaxed way to learn about racing and find out just how easy and fun it can be.

Here are a few more details:

The Fun Race is only 25 minute long and if you can tack, gybe and sail a triangle you will have no difficulty in taking part. There will be a support boat and an instructor on the water giving help and advice to anyone that needs it. There will someone to help get your boat on and off the water and a tow if necessary to get you out to the start line.

For those new to the fun race.

- 1. <u>Find a boat</u> if you are using a club boat ask an instructor to allocate one for you to use. If you have your own boat do ask if you need help rigging
- 2. <u>Sign on</u> Outside the clubhouse there will be a form, please put your full name clearly on it together with the other information required (there will be someone there to help if you are not sure where and what to put).
- 3. **Briefing:** Before the race the person running the race will explain where the race will be and the marks to go around. They will also explain how you will know when the race is about to star (and stop).
- 4. Head out to the sailing area by the Maid of Kent.

Looking forward to seeing you there, and it would be lovely to see some new sailors having a go along with the regulars.

Junior Saturday Club

Do make sure children are changed ready to sail at new start times 9:00 and 13:30. Sessions start with a general briefing, this is for the benefit of parents and children, please don't think you can have an extra five minutes in bed and miss it, it is part of our push to improve communication and punctuality. Being punctual will give more time on the water, please respect others by being on time.

Race Coaching 16th Feb - report by Jeff

We were unable to run a Feva session as we only had two youths sign-up although they had done their best to persuade others to join in. They joined the Topper group giving us seven, which was a really good number.

The morning session was focussed on race starts with some theory before heading out onto the water in near zero temperatures. Fortunately the wind was a steady F3 from the East. The first exercise was sailing in a box creating conditions typical of pre-start. This gets them used to close quarters sailing and the associated rules. Sailing out of the box or having a collision were penalised by penalty turns. We then moved on to actual starts. Closeness to the line at the start improved significantly over the session. Eagerness resulted in what would have been a general recall. By this time hands and feet were getting cold and we headed in, follow my leader style, for lunch and warmth.



Training & Development

The afternoon started with more theory, this time on leeward mark roundings. Three of our youngsters opted not to venture onto the water in the afternoon.

Thanks to Jo for her help and enthusiasm, Jo is an SI and Race Coach, who has joined us following the unfortunate closure of WWSC. Thanks also to Will for helping on powerboat.
